Highlights of Dope Control Program in 2018

4194 dope tests were carried out during the year 2018 as compared to 3363 carried out in 2016 and 3594 tests carried out during the year 2017. In an effort to reduce the incidence of doping, anti-doping education cum awareness programmes were pro-actively conducted to include school and youth level athletes. A total of 84 such programmes cum workshops were conducted during 2018 as compared to 52 in 2016 and 64 in 2017. The incidence of doping reduced to less than 70 violations during the year 2018 as compared to 77 cases in 2016 and 73 cases in 2017. This has improved India's position globally with regard to dope control.
